
Carnivores by Aaron Reynolds, ill. Dan Santat (Chronicle, 2013)




The Dark by Lemony Snicket, illus. by Jon Klassen (Little, Brown Books for Young Readers, 2013)




Mr. Wuffles by David Wiesner (Clarion, 2013)




Boy on the Porch by Sharon Creech (HarperCollins, 2013)

Jake and Lily by Jerry Spinelli (Balzer & Bray, 2012)



Flora and Ulysses by Kate DiCamillo, Ill. By K.G. Campbell






The Lord of Opium by Nancy Farmer. (Atheneum Books for Young Readers, 2013)

Summary: As the teenage ruler of his own country, Matt must cope with clones and cartels in this riveting sequel to the modern classic *House of the Scorpion*, winner of the National Book Award, a Newbery Honor, and a Printz Honor.

Matt has always been nothing but a clone—grown from a strip of old El Patron's skin. Now, at age fourteen, he finds himself suddenly thrust into the position of ruling over his own country. The Land of Opium is the largest territory of the Dope Confederacy, which ranges on the map like an intestine from the ruins of San Diego to the ruins of Matamoros. But while Opium thrives, the rest of the world has been devastated by ecological disaster—and hidden in Opium is the cure. (Taken by Amazon.com)



The Extra by Kathryn Lasky (Candlewick, 2013)

Summary: One ordinary afternoon, fifteen-year-old Lilo and her family are suddenly picked up by Hitler's police and imprisoned as part of the "Gypsy plague." Just when it seems certain that they will be headed to a labor camp, Lilo is chosen by filmmaker Leni Riefenstahl to work as a film extra. Life on the film set is a bizarre alternate reality. The surroundings are glamorous, but Lilo and the other extras are barely fed, closely guarded, and kept in a locked barn when not on the movie set. And the beautiful, charming Riefenstahl is always present, answering the slightest provocation with malice, flaunting the power to assign prisoners to life or death. Lilo takes matters into her own hands, effecting an escape and running for her life. In this chilling but ultimately uplifting novel, Kathryn Lasky imagines the lives of the Gypsies who worked as extras for the real Nazi filmmaker Leni Riefenstahl, giving readers a story of survival unlike any other. 

Summary: Willow Chance is a twelve-year-old genius, obsessed with nature and diagnosing medical conditions, who finds it comforting to count by 7s. It has never been easy for her to connect with anyone other than her adoptive parents, but that hasn't kept her from leading a quietly happy life . . . until now.

Suddenly Willow's world is tragically changed when her parents both die in a car crash, leaving her alone in a baffling world. The triumph of this book is that it is *not* a tragedy.

Whatever After (#3): Sink or Swim by Sarah Mlynowski






Fault in our Stars by John Green (Dutton Books, 2012)


